The fund will run from 1st may to 30th April each year and will be topped up each year to at least the original agreed amount.

Grants on offer will be available to associations, leagues, clubs, and individuals whether new or established.

The loan scheme will be widened and made more accessible to eligible parties.

Application rounds will be announced each year and advertised in the appropriate manner to ensure widespread coverage.

Club Health Checker

The ESMBA and BDA have collaborated on an online Club Health Checker, which provides an insight and report into the health of your Club.

Testing will begin shortly, and we invite clubs to be part of the beta testing for this new system.

What is the Club Health Checker?

The Club Health Checker is a free, online self-assessment tool that will identify the challenges faced by your bowls club and highlights areas for targeted growth.

Through the completion of a 30-minute questionnaire a customised report is created which offers resources and suggestions on how to improve the clubs' areas of development. It is recommended that clubs use this resource at least once a year to help measure their baseline participation, growth, and impact. The Club Health Checker is available to all clubs affiliated to BDA partnership NGBs which include Bowls England, English Indoor Bowling Association, British Torom Green Bowling Association and English Short Mat Bowling Association.

The Club Health Checker is not a 'Pass or Fail' assessment but rather a tool to help committees assess the current condition of the club and identify areas for development. The report is as accurate as the information you input, and to ensure that the report reflects your club's position, it is important to answer the assessment honestly.

Greater Manchester Association help breath new life into a historic venue.

Greater Manchester SMBA, have worked closely with the Etherow Indoor Bowling Centre committee and their sponsor, TPS, to secure this superb venue for their bowlers and they are excited to see the benefits this will bring for all our competition entrants this year who can spend less time worrying about the peculiarities of the floor and more time focusing on their game!

Nestled in the lovely village of Broadbottom in Greater Manchester, the venue was a former railway warehouse. Brought from British Rail in 1985 and repurposed, the Etherow Indoor Bowling Centre has a perfectly level floor, and lots of natural light. The Centre has Wygreen carpet and mats and offers long mat and short mat bowling opportunities alike to people of all ages and abilities.

This venue was facing imminent closure when the local bowling community stepped in to save the facility. Etherow Centre has been used as an Indoor Bowling Centre for 10 years, the Etherow Charitable Trust has now signed an agreement to initially keep the facility open until March 2024

Greater Manchester SMBA now use this centre as their County Base and in 2024/25 season are pleased to be hosting the England Ladies Short Mat Bowls Squad.

Camelot SMBC – A Journey fit for a Fairytale

Camelot Short Mat Bowls Club is 35 years old this year and as with life they have had their ups and downs. They were re a founder member of the Blackmore Vale League (BVL) which crosses borders between Somerset and Dorset.

Originally in a hall in Queen Camel, Somerset we started strongly managing to attract 60 members

and that was despite an undulating wooden floor which incorporated an orchestra pit.

These were less than ideal conditions for short mat bowls, but we did have some sort of home advantage!! However, a similar story to most, by the time of the pandemic, the club's membership was



dwindling and it was struggling to remain viable or attract new members.

If Camelot was to survive changes were needed. A new village hall, with a flat floor, had been built at Galhampton, a village 2 miles away. Camelot SMBC was relocated and promoted to the local community. As a result of the club's positive, friendly, and supportive atmosphere during club nights the membership doubled.

Camelot and its new players entered the post covid BMV League in Winter 22 and for many this was their first experience of playing matches. The League was a good learning opportunity. The club provided a friendly welcome to visiting teams but gained few points. Players were however developing their skills and adapting to the different atmosphere that exists in competitive matches and identifying their preferred roles.

To continue the rapid development of players the club entered the newly established BVL Summer League. This was a big step-up, and overall, a very positive experience. The team has performed well against teams that have experienced players and has gained a good number of impressive wins. The most pleasing aspect of this improvement is that 17 new members are involved in league matches. Thanks to the dedication and commitment of a few, the club is now well re-established and has a promising future.
